



LIKELIHOOD OF OCCUPATIONS COMPARED TO NONVETERANS

Veterans are **4.252 times more likely** to be in the **Protective Service**occupation than their nonveteran
counterparts

Veterans are **2.260 times more likely** to be in the **Installation, Maintenance, and Repair** occupation than their nonveteran counterparts

Veterans are 2.253 times more likely to be in the Transportation and Material Moving occupation than their nonveteran counterparts

LIKELIHOOD OF INDUSTRY COMPARED TO NONVETERANS


Veterans are 2.927 times more likely to be in the Public Administration industry than their nonveteran counterparts


Veterans are 2.429 times more likely to be in the Transportation and Warehousing industry than their nonveteran counterparts
